

Dear Friends,

I've now been in post as the new Priest-in-Charge for one month and much has happened. The Licensing Service was a truly uplifting occasion and the warmth and fellowship of the evening will live on in my memory. I want to record again my very grateful thanks to everyone who helped in any way to make the evening so wonderful and I



am only sorry that some of you were unable to attend because of the absolutely atrocious weather conditions.

I also want to give special thanks here to all those who have helped us out in the past two years, by preaching and presiding and so on; to Gill & Janet for their work as wardens; to Keith and Doreen who have continued to lead the worship; to Jean in her role as Lay Chair of the PCC; to the team of volunteers who maintain the building and the churchyard; . and to each and every one of the congregation for remaining faithful throughout the interregnum and for your support for me.

I am now beginning to settle into the nitty gritty of learning the ropes of a new job. I have attended a two-day consultation about my change in post and was able to share with others in a similar situation. There have, inevitably, been some minor teething problems. The installation of the vicarage phone number (338 2368) has resulted in innumerable 'cold callers', and there has been much red tape in transferring names and addresses and with the re-direction of mail, but these will sort themselves out eventually.

I imagine that the first disciples might have felt a bit like this as well. Following their euphoria at being filled with the Holy Spirit at the first Pentecost, they would have had to come down to earth and learn how best to go out and spread the gospel. Where should they start, how should they prioritise such a massive undertaking?

As I mentioned in last month's magazine, I'm planning to hold a series of brainstorming sessions when anyone can raise items that they believe need attention and then we'll look at each in turn. The first of these will be on Tuesday 7th May at 7.45p.m. in the Church Lounge. Please put this date in your diaries and come along and tell us your views.

On Thursday 9 May we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord and there will be a service of Holy Communion at 8.00pm on that day.

On 19 May, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the first disciples. I pray that we, too, may receive that same gift and be ready and willing to tell others about the Good News of Jesus – the love that Jesus has for each of us and how he gave of himself to save the world

In the afternoon of Whit Sunday, we will join with the other churches in Stalybridge for the annual Procession of Witness. It is the turn of the Baptist Church to lead this year's procession and, as they usually walk with us, we will follow them. The joint service will, like last year, be held in the Civic Hall. There has been discontent raised in some areas about holding the service indoors in a break with tradition. Clergy from the Stalybridge churches will be discussing this issue soon. In the meantime, I hope that as many as are able will walk with us.

I will finish with a verse that was in one of the many cards I received on 22nd March.

To step beyond our own limitations
No matter how small those steps may be
Is to start on a road of exciting self discovery.
We are all much more than we usually believe ourselves to be.

May we take those first small steps this Pentecost and see where they will lead us.

Scams and reporting scams

Internet and telephone scams are a scourge to everyone and especially to the more vulnerable and innocent in our society. I would ask you all to advise your families and your friends not to pass on any kind of

personal details over the telephone or indeed the internet.

The scams vary in nature from offering to improve your pension to such a company owes you money that you've not claimed back.



Not too long ago a lady received a call from an alleged police officer in Surrey claiming that her card had been cloned and would she confirm the details.

A similar scam has recently come to light in our area. It needs be stressed that in no circumstances should any detail be passed on. Don't have doubts, cut the call and report it.

Last year there was a potential scam with regards to personal pensions. There is a distinct possibility that this particular one is doing the rounds again.

Please advise as many friends and neighbours as possible be very wary and alert. All of us are potential victims. A number to ring is **ACTION FRAUD 0300-123-2040** reporting any such call with as much information as possible.
