# **EXCHANGE OF RINGS**

The bride and groom say something like "I (name) give you (name) this ring as a sign of our marriage..."

# **DECLARATION OF MARRIAGE**

The celebrant declares that \_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_ are husband and wife and says the marriage blessing.

# C. THE REGISTRATION

The registers (X2) are signed and the marriage certificate is signed and presented.

# D. PRAYERS

The Officiant (or a friend or family member) leads appropriate prayers for the couple and their life together, usually including the Lord's Prayer, followed by the final blessing

# E. INTRODUCTION OF NEWLYWEDS (optional)

The Officiant may say "I present to you Mr. and Mrs.
\_\_\_\_\_\_" if they are changing their names or "I present to you the newly married couple, Jane and John" if they are not. The guests stand and applaud, as the couple then lead the recessional out of the Church

# **MUSIC & HYMNS**

There are different points in the service where you may choose to have music (by the organist, on CD or played by a friend) - the entrance of the bride, during the registration, as the bride and groom process out of church—or at another suitable point.

If you choose to sing hymns they are usually placed between the different sections of the service (Sections A-E underlined above).

# **A. INTRODUCTION**

# **WELCOME**

Friends, welcome to St George's. My name is ............... We have been invited here today to share with \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ a very important moment in their lives. In the years they have been together, their love and understanding of each other has grown and matured, and now they have decided to live their lives together as husband and wife. They have come to seek God's blessing ...

# LIGHTING OF UNITY CANDLE OR OTHER UNITY CEREMONY (optional)

Some couples are choosing to add a unity ceremony. They light two candles to represent their individual lives and all they bring into their relationship and then later they light a single candle to represent the unity of their marriage.

## AN OPENING PRAYER

Typically, it says something about love, relationships, or marriages and recognizing/seeking God's blessing

# **DEFINITION OF MARRIAGE** (Preface)

Here the Officiant says some words about marriage in general and a Christian understanding of marriage.

# **DECLARATIONS**

You, followed by the congregation, are invited to declare any reasons why you should not be married. Then you agree to take each other as husband and

wife and your family and friends agree to support you in your marriage.

## **READING/S**

A suitable reading or readings which say something about love, relationship and the meaning of marriage. There is usually a short Bible reading but other readings may be included.

## **ADDRESS**

Sometimes the celebrant may offer a reflection for this special day.

# **B. THE MARRIAGE**

# THE GIVING IN MARRIAGE (optional)

The traditional wording is "Who gives this woman to be wedded to this man" but as it is the 21st century, many couples opt for something such as "Who supports this couple in their marriage?" or "Who supports this woman/man in her/his marriage to this man/woman?" or choose to leave it out altogether.

# **VOWS**

You each make your marriage vows.

I, N, take you, N, to be my wife/husband,
to have and to hold, from this day forward;
for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish,
till death us do part; according to God's holy law. In
the presence of God I make this vow.
