Wallet Watchers

I recently watched the Martin Lewis Money Show, which had a special focus on energy saving tips for around the house. Consider sharing advice with your congregations & working out how some of those tips might be applied in churches and halls too.

Greg Jackson, the owner of Octopus Energy (who have recently taken on Bulb customers), gave an interesting fact in his interview with Martin: October energy consumption is down 37% since last year. The unseasonably warm autumn will account for some of that (another clear indication of climate change). However, energy price hikes are also kicking in and I expect some of the reduction comes from people choosing to be more energy efficient.

It often has to hit our wallets before we take notice, but change is possible and therefore carbon reduction is achievable. Keep trying everyone!


