Friends

In this Easter season, how does Philippians 2 help us to understand more about the cross?

Jesus' Example (v6-8)

'He did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage... And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled himself by becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross!'

Paul reminds us of how Jesus, although fully God from eternity, entered our world as a man to take on a life of service. '*He made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.*' He completely surrendered Himself, by identifying with all the weakness, problems, and frailties of human life. This took Him to the cross, where He rescued us from the power of sin and death, so that we might know God's eternal life.

Our Response (v3-5)

Paul says that our relationships should reflect the same attitude as Jesus: 'Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.' We should look out for the needs of others before our own. This will transform our relationships at home and church. How practically can we develop a *cross attitude*?

God's Purpose (v9-11)

The resurrection demonstrates how God has exalted Jesus in triumph: 'Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name' (v9). Our willingness to serve, like Jesus, will be rewarded by God, especially when we feel used or exploited.

'This is our God, The Servant King, He calls us now to follow Him, To bring our lives as a daily offering, Of worship to The Servant King' (Graham Kendrick)

You can do this at home, leading up to Easter!

Why not put a small cross in your front window as Lent draws to a close, and Easter Week approaches? You can use a Palm cross or a wooden one. A cross is a visible reminder of the death of Jesus, and the Christian meaning of Easter and Resurrection.

Mystery of the Passion

"I am the resurrection and the life, he who believes in me though he were dead yet shall he live" John 11:25

It would have been hard on Good Friday for anyone to imagine the glory that was coming on Sunday morning. On Friday the situation seemed hopeless: Peter denied Christ three times; Judas committed suicide; the other disciples scattered in fear; Jesus prayed until His sweat became drops of blood; on the cross He cried out 'My God, My God why have you forsaken me?' The sky turned black as He died, the curtain in the temple was torn in two and Mary's heart was pierced.

All of this suffering bought our salvation, our healing, our peace and our eternal life. Because through His blood we are transformed into the sons and daughters of God!

The mystery of the 'passion of Christ' is almost incomprehensible, but whatever you are facing today I want to encourage you that Jesus has already paid the price for that....If we are sad 'Jesus wept', and He bought our joy. If we are sick, He purchased our healing. If we are troubled, He bought our peace. And for all the wrong things we have done, He bought our redemption from sin. We have been bought with a great price, and we are His.

UK churches use lights and prayers to support Ukraine

Cathedrals were floodlit in the colours of the Ukrainian flag, candles were lit, and services, prayer vigils and other events were recently held across the country in churches to mark the first anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine on 24th February.

Many of the Church of England's Cathedrals and churches held prayer vigils that included contributions from Ukrainian refugees.

In rural as well as urban areas, many parishes where families are still hosting Ukrainian refugees, opened their doors for prayer, reflection and music.

The Bishop of Bradford, Toby Howarth, said: "Russia's brutal invasion of Ukraine one year ago has caused misery not only for Ukrainians, but has led to immense hardship for many others across the world."

Mary Gregory, Canon for Arts and Reconciliation at Coventry Cathedral, said: "The vigil gave us an opportunity to acknowledge the terrible pain and loss of the last year, to remember those who have died, and to pray

All in the month of April

It was:

150 years ago, on 4th April 1873 that the Kennel Club was founded in London.

100 years ago, on 15th April 1923 that insulin became generally available for the treatment of diabetes.

Also 100 years ago, on 26th April 1923 that Prince Albert, Duke of York (later King George VI) married Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon (later Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother) at Westminster Abbey in London.

80 years ago, on 30th April 1943 that the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp was established in Germany.

75 years ago, on 7th April 1948 that the World Health Organization (WHO) was founded in Geneva, Switzerland.

70 years ago, on 16th April 1953 that Queen Elizabeth II launched the Royal Yacht Britannia. It was decommissioned in 1997.

50 years ago, on 4th April 1973 that the World Trade Centre in New York City was officially opened. It was destroyed in the 9/11 terrorist attacks in 2001.

Also 50 years ago, on 8th April 1973 that Pablo Picasso, Spanish artist died..

30 years ago, on 22nd April 1993 that Stephen Lawrence, an 18-year-old British teenager, was murdered in a racially motivated attack while waiting for a bus in Eltham, London.

30 years ago, on 29th April 1993 that Queen Elizabeth II announced that Buckingham Palace would open to the public for the first time, to raise funds to repair fire damage at Windsor Castle.

Also 30 years ago, on 30th April 1993 that CERN, the creators of the World Wide Web, announced that it could be used for free by anyone. That decision has shaped the modern world as we know it.

25 years ago, on 10th April 1998 that the Good Friday Agreement was signed in Northern Ireland.

20 years ago, on 9th April 2003 that US troops took control of Iraq's capital city, Baghdad.

It was 60 years ago that Cadbury's made their first Crème Eggs: the Creme Egg is the best-selling confectionery item between New Year's Day and Easter in the UK, with annual sales of more than 200 million eggs, worth about £55 million.




