## **A note from the wardens.....**

Most of us have been in situations where we are not in control, and we don't know how to feel or how to react to our situation. We need help.

The most valuable gift you can have at those times – is time itself. Time to be 'listened to'. Really listened to. But it is not easy to find someone who will 'actively listen' to you.

Think of the last time you were in the reverse position with a friend or a colleague, and they were talking to you. How easily do you recall what they actually said? Most of us are so busy getting our replies ready for when the person has finished speaking, that we don't clearly hear their punch line.

With God it is different. We can take everything to Him; all our worries and cares and failures and faults. And He listens. He has listened to our prayers for a new vicar.

He doesn't necessarily jump in with an instant, easy solution, but rather He promises to always guide us, if we ask Him, through life's challenges, and He promises to never leave us. He often speaks to us through his written word, the Bible.

Silence is not a natural state for many of us – and yet it is in the quiet we can hear ourselves and God most clearly. So, when we talk with God, our conversation should not be rushed and one-sided. We need to give space to our silence before Him, to wait and listen for Him to speak to us.

Next time you worship in church, listen to the silences: the spaces between the words, the music and the actions. Listen to all the prayers that are spoken.

Look at your surroundings and reflect that they have absorbed thousands of prayers – and holy silence – down the centuries of their existence.

As we move into a new chapter for St George's with our new vicar, Denise, look out the window and see the vastness of the sky above you – and let your prayers join with those that have gone before you.

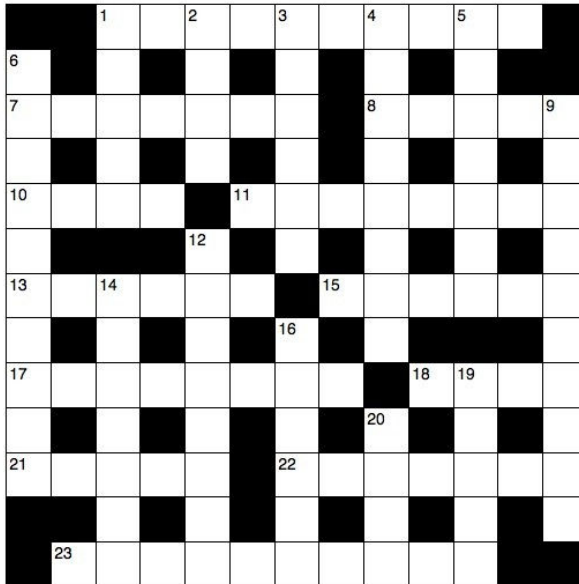

## "George's Kitchen" - reaching out to our local community



"George's Kitchen" is a volunteer group based at St George's Church

We were formed during the height of the pandemic in 2021, with help from the Big Local and Action Together, both of whom continue to support us. Our mission is to reach out to the most isolated, vulnerable members of our community by providing them with a free weekly home-cooked frozen meal, as well as an opportunity for a little bit of conversation on their doorstep

Our volunteers fulfil a number of different roles ...

All our meals are cooked with reference to defined shopping lists, so we have people who undertake the weekly shop for us and deliver it to the church.

Then, our cooks prepare the meals from scratch in our kitchen at St George's Church - typically, these cooking sessions take place on Wednesday mornings. Our volunteer cooks are ably supported by kitchen prep assistants - it really is a team effort !

At around noon on each Wednesday, our delivery people arrive at the church to collect the meals and distribute them to our recipients. We currently deliver about 45 meals per week to local folk in the immediate surrounding area. Anyone can claim a meal, there is no charge - we just ask that our recipients live nearby in Stalybridge; we prefer to focus on individuals who maybe find it tough getting out and about or perhaps don't have that many visitors during the week.

All these roles are coordinated by another volunteer who prepares a monthly rota of tasks, so everyone knows exactly what they are doing and no-one is left unsupported in their role.

The work continues behind the scenes too, as other volunteers maintain our social media presence, prepare and review menus and fulfil other chores like labelling up the meals and preparing posters and leaflets advertising our service.

## Happy Holidays

*'From Troas we put out to sea and sailed straight for Samothrace... we went on to Neapolis. From there we travelled to Philippi, a Roman colony and the leading city of that district[a] of Macedonia. And we stayed there several days. (Acts 16:11-12)*

I wonder if travel was in some ways easier in St Paul's day! No waiting at airports, cancelled flights or passport problems. The Roman Empire had an amazing system of well-maintained roads, provided with inns, guards, signposts and milestones. Everyone spoke Greek and the currency was interchangeable. We do not live in classical times so how should we prepare for holidays?

Choose your holiday from a reliable travel company that is a member of the professional bodies that protect customers if it all goes wrong. Pay for the holiday using a credit card, so you can claim against the credit company if there is a serious problem.

Prepare and research where you are going. Look up the Government travel advice pages on staying safe and healthy in that country.

Get someone to look after your house and pets while you are away. Make sure it does not look as though it is empty.

Get proper insurance that covers what you need. The Association of British Insurers has advice online about travel insurance, including how COVID-19 can affect it, and a guide on choosing the right travel insurance policy.

Rules on claiming health benefits in Europe have changed. It is now the Global Health Insurance Card.

When on holiday, keep your belongings safe and avoid dangerous places. Do not keep all your holiday cash in one place. If you lost your wallet, would you have details of what numbers to phone to stop your card? Take more than one credit/debit card with you, and keep them separately.

### Off on holiday? Here are some holiday soothies!

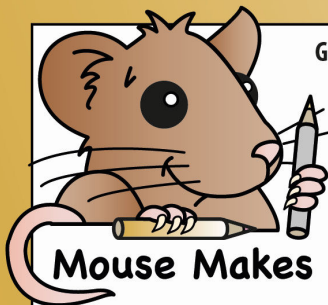
For dealing with motion sickness, ginger capsules are your new friend. Available from any health store, they do a wonderful job in calming upset tummies.

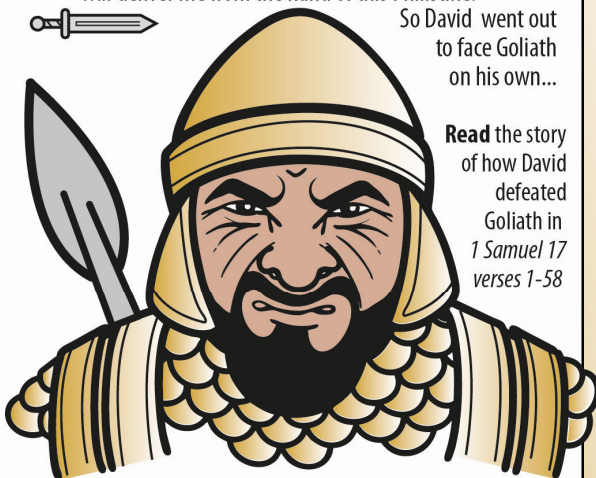

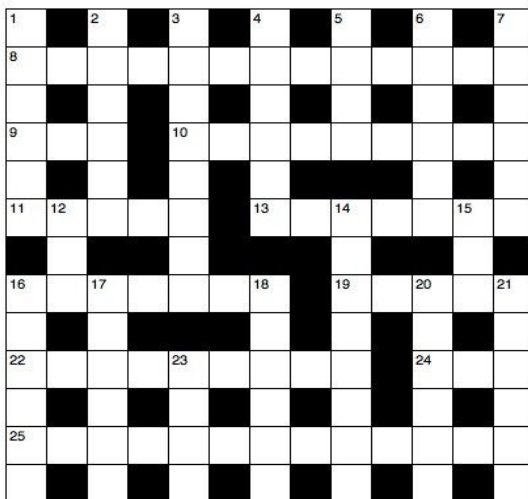
