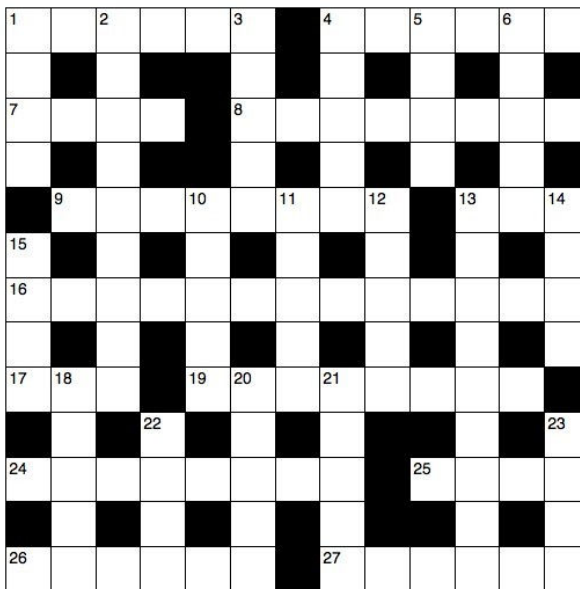

St George's PCC has agreed to register for Eco Church. Eco Church is an initiative by A Rocha which is a Christian charity whose aim is to 'Care for God's Earth' and one way it does this is through Eco Church. Many churches in this Diocese and Deanery have registered, and quite a few have gained the first award which is Bronze. I hope that the church can work towards achieving this award in the future.

There are a number of categories that we need to look at and report back on. An example of one of the categories is Worship and Teaching, this involves ensuring that creation care is mentioned in our services, not every week, but fairly regularly; another is Buildings, this is a challenge for many churches, but involves looking at how we can make the church more energy efficient.

There are more of these categories for us to work on, but others have done it and so can we.

Is this something you could get involved with? It would be helpful to have a small working party to look into the various Eco Church categories and think about what we could do to become more eco-friendly as a congregation.

This is the window the small picture came from in the



November magazine. Did you recognise it last time? It's a really interesting choice for a stained-glass window as it depicts St Paul speaking to Agrippa. He is explaining why he has become a disciple of Christ and why he is willing to defend the faith even when he is in chains. You may notice the words at the bottom of the window

from the King James Bible, 'Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian.' (Acts 26.28) Agrippa is resting his chin in his hand as though he is paying attention to and thinking about what Paul is saying. He doesn't become a Christian as far as we are aware.

I wonder when you (or I, actually!) last tried to persuade someone of the truth of the gospel? What words would you use? What personal experience of God would you share? In 1 Peter 3 we're told that we should be ready to speak about our faith when we're given the chance. It doesn't have to be very eloquent or deeply theological; it just needs to be sincere.

Why not have a think about what you said in the past or what you might say in the future if someone asks you why you go to church?

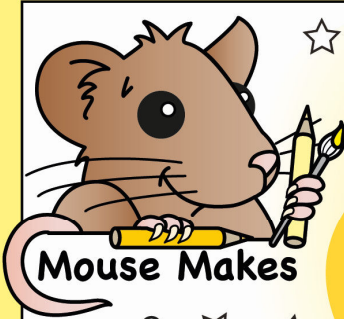

Christmas Wordsearch

The story of 'Silent Night'

This much-loved carol comes from Austria, where it was first sung as *Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht* on Christmas Eve, 1818. It was written by Father Joseph Mohr, a young priest at St Nicholas parish church, in the village of Oberndorf bei Salzburg. As Christmas 1818 approached, he asked the local schoolmaster, Franz Xaver Gruber, to compose a melody for his carol. Gruber was organist in the nearby village of Arnsdorf, and so was happy to oblige. On Christmas Eve they presented the carol to the church during the midnight mass. The carol went on to become loved world-wide; and the version sung by Bing Crosby is the third best-selling single of all time.
