Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I've been reading a book recently, written by a priest based at St Martin-in-the-Fields in London, called *The City is My Monastery*. The priest, Richard Carter, has founded a community, a group of people, who live according to a simple rule of life. He did this in response to his ministry in a very busy church and city after having spent time on retreat. One of the questions he felt called to consider was 'What do you

seek?' This is a version of the question Jesus asks of his would-be disciples in John chapter 1 verse 38.

It's a fairly simple question on one level, but incredibly challenging on another. If we really seriously consider what we seek or what we truly want I wonder what our answers would be. We all need things like food, water and shelter; health, a happy family and friends; is there anything to seek or want beyond that?

As Christians we might all, I hope, say that there is something more to life than these things important though they are. There is meaning and purpose which can only be properly found in God. There's a universal story of redemption and hope. There's a need beyond our material and emotional needs which can only be satisfied through God in Christ. We might say that these longings are soul longings, longings for things of the spirit. A longing and desire for the deeper spiritual things and needs that only God can provide. A longing and desire for mystery and the numinous.

Those first disciples who questioned Jesus in the Gospel of John may not have been entirely aware of what they truly sought, wanted or needed, but they saw that in Jesus there was something more than an everyday familiar life, and it was something that they wanted to find for themselves. Words and phrases like the ones I've used above, 'mystery and numinous,' 'deeper spiritual things,' can sound wishy-washy and unconnected to reality. They can sound too abstract, but when we consider or seek something that is beyond our material needs, we should really be looking at Jesus because he is the ultimate incarnation of all those seemingly abstract things. He is the complete and only incarnation of God in whom we find all our spiritual and soul longings fulfilled. When we seek to have our deepest, inner longings met; when we acknowledge that there is something calling us into meaning and purpose, then we look to Christ and find what we are looking for. Ultimately, I hope we are all seeking a life centred on Christ and the love of God we find in him.

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Spring Fair

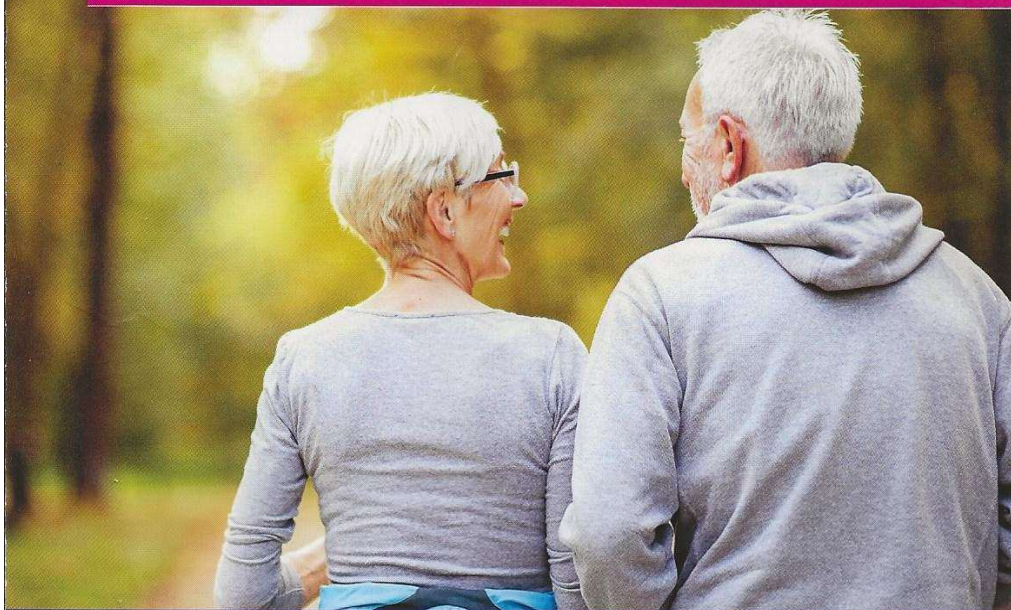
On Saturday 10th May we held our annual Spring Fair, this was well supported and raised £1337.87 towards church funds.

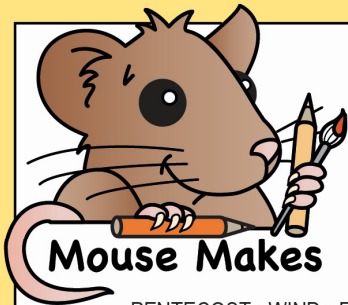

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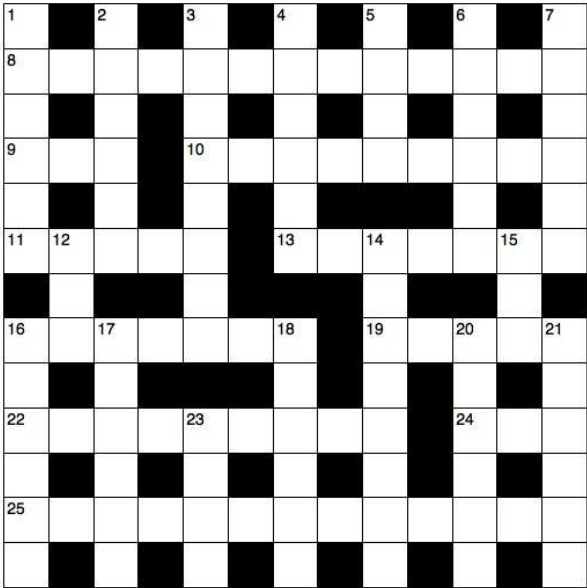

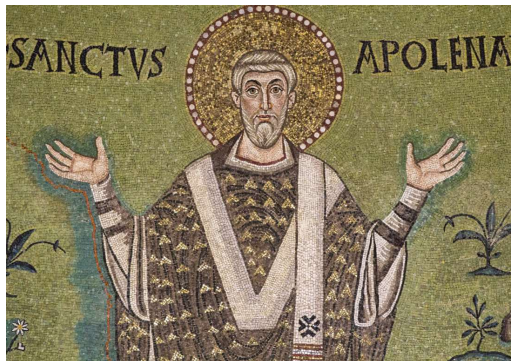

Why Do We Do That?

Have you ever wondered why I stand at the altar with my arms and hands pointing upwards? This is called the *orans position* and is a very ancient posture in which to pray. The idea is to have your elbows close to the body with your palms up as you pray. This posture is used during a service of Holy Communion when the priest prays on behalf of the people. So, you'll see this posture being used during the Collect and Eucharistic Prayer for example. It's an outward sign of the priest praying the prayers of God's people. God's people respond with the word 'Amen' as a way of assenting or agreeing to those prayers.

You may also notice that the priest's hands are usually folded together during congregational prayers. This signifies that it is now the whole community's turn to pray together while the priest remains silent or joins in quietly. So, the orans position is used when the priest is praying alone and on behalf of the people, and the hands together position is adopted when the people are praying collectively. This isn't to say that the congregation is not praying when the priest is leading the prayers and using the orans position nor that only the priest can use this gesture. In fact, many people hold their hands out or up while they are praying as a sign that they are receptive to God and God's call.

I should also say that the word 'orans' means praying or pleading and you may also see this posture depicted in religious art. Some very early Christian commentators saw this stance as a reflection of the position of Christ on the cross and was thus seen as an appropriate posture for Christian prayer.
