Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I'm writing this in the week when we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit in power to the disciples. It's a wonderful celebration of how those first disciples were given the ability to speak not only other languages, but to speak with confidence about the faith, and to begin to form what we call the 'Church'.

I've written 'Church' with a capital 'C' because I mean the whole Church, not just the church in Stalybridge or Mossley, but the Church which worships and prays in every country of the world. The Church of England is part of this worldwide or catholic Church as are all our individual parishes. I'm sure you're all aware of the many divisions within the Church, and sadly within the Church of England, but I like to think that, although God sees those divisions, for him, there is only one Church. This is the Church which is unified by baptism and by our common belief that Christ is the Son of God, that Christ died for us, and that he rose again. There is another thing which unites us as God's people, and that is the Lord's Prayer.

We pray the Lord's Prayer whenever we meet and those opening words, 'Our Father' are very powerful if we think about them. 'Our Father'. In the Church we share a loving and divine parent, our heavenly Father and that also means we are one huge family. A family that has many, many, many members across the world most of whom we'll never meet. These are our sisters and brothers. We share a Father and we share God's Spirit. We all have the Holy Spirit living in us, all Christians in all churches wherever we are. This is the gift given at Pentecost which God continues to share with his people.

There are things that divide us as Christians and there are also wonderful things that unite us. I lament the divisions but praise God for the things that join us together as one family.

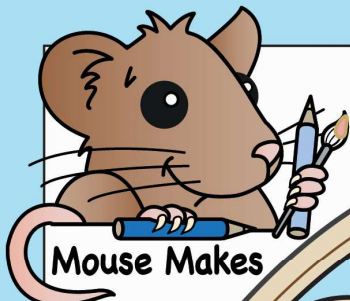

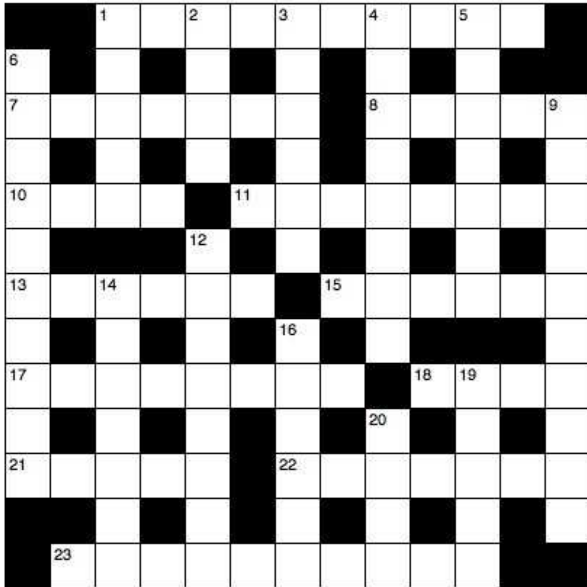

Mary - the virgin mother of Jesus. Her visit to Elizabeth, when both were pregnant, is a moving account of two humble, ordinary women, suddenly caught up in a great event that would shape world history. Their trusting faith in God and acceptance of His will, shine through.

After Jesus is born, Mary makes few appearances: when the family visits Jerusalem and she loses her Son on the way home; when she urges Him to help the wedding party in Cana with its wine problem; and when Jesus gives her into the keeping of the beloved disciple when He is dying on the cross. Mary's last appearance is in Acts, just before Pentecost.

Mary, chosen to be the mother of Jesus Christ, one who is both God and Man, holds a unique place in history. Down the centuries that have followed, the Church has paid special honour to Mary – and well deserved it is. "All generations shall call me blessed..."

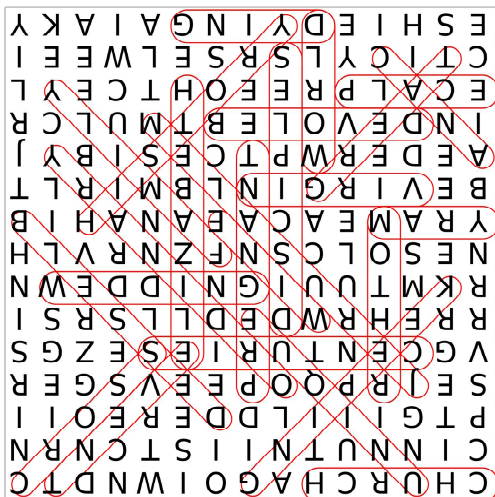

### Fathers' Day, a time to celebrate male role models

In the UK, USA and Canada, the third Sunday in June is Father's Day. It's usually a good time for sons and daughters to take their father to his favourite restaurant, or to watch a favoured sport, or whatever else he enjoys doing.

How do these special days ever get started, anyway? Well, Father's Day began because way back in 1909 there was a woman in Spokane, Washington, named Sonora Louise Smart Dodd. She heard a church sermon about the merits of setting aside a day to honour one's mother. Mother's Day was just beginning to gather widespread attention in the United States at this time. But Sonora Louise Smart Dodd knew that it was her father who had selflessly raised herself and her five siblings by himself after their mother had died in childbirth. So the sermon on mothers gave Sonora Louise the idea to petition for a day to honour fathers, and in particular, her own father, William Jackson Smart.

Sonora Louise soon set about planning the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane in 1910. With support from the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA, her efforts paid off, and a 'Father's Day' was appointed. Sonora Louise had wanted Father's Day to be on the first Sunday in June as that was her father's birthday, but the city council didn't have time to approve it until later in the month. And so on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1910, the first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane.

This year it falls on 21st June. How will you celebrate it?
